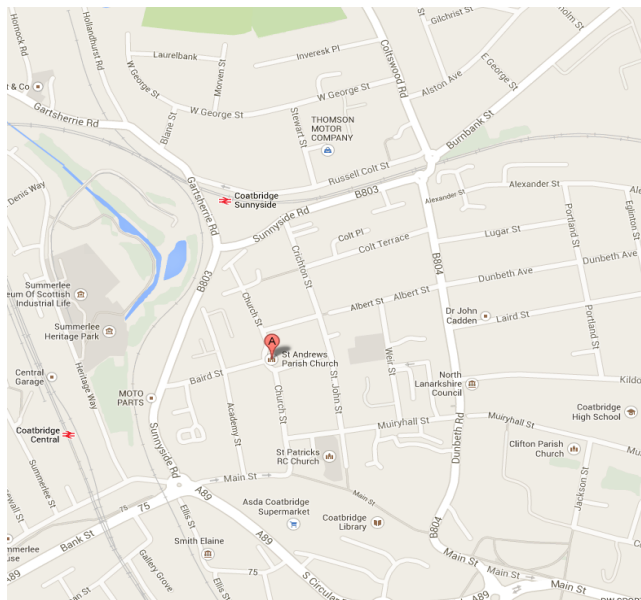

The Lanarkshire Society of Organists looks forward to welcoming members of the Scottish Federation of Organists to the 54<sup>th</sup> Conference and Annual General Meeting to be held in New St. Andrew's Church, Coatbridge.

This year the Celebrity Organ Recital will be given by Professor Ian Tracey, Organist Titulaire of Liverpool Cathedral. The organ is a fine example of a Father Willis built in 1870, originally tracker action, but altered to tubular pneumatic circa 1930 by Andrew Watt of Glasgow.

The musical programme for the day will also include a recital by the Cairn String Quartet. This is a group formed in 2007 by graduates of RSAMD (now the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland). They won the prestigious Scottish Institute for Enterprise New Ideas competition, since when they have never looked back. They will give us a classical programme.

We will also have a talk/demonstration about the recording of sound. This will be given by Norman McGadie, for many years a sound recordist with the BBC. As well as the technical details, he will tell us of the joys and sorrows of life doing outside broadcasts. He also has experience recording organs, choirs and services. He has entitled his talk enigmatically "Quest for SILENCE".
